As India's growing military prowess and mesmerizing cultural diversity was on grand display at Rajpat on 63rd Republic day. The Election Commission sent out a message loud and clear on the importance of voting to keep the world's largest democracy alive and vibrant.

For the first time on Republic Day, the EC had its own tableau showing a large electronic voting machine and a banner urging the people to vote. As



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many as five States are going to the polls within weeks and the EC observed January 25 as National Voter's Day to maximize voter enrolment and enhance the quality of Indian democracy.

The EC tableaux was not the only first in the Republic Day parade in the capital. A woman officer, Flight Lieutenant Sneha Shekhawat, led the marching contingent of the Indian Air Force, which also showcased its latest acquisition -three C-130 J Super Hercules aircraft purchased from the USA.

The Defence Research and Development Organisation displayed its most potent missile Agni-IV that can strike at a target 3,000 km away as shown in a successful test in November. Army Para-commandos on double march were also back in action after a gap.
